AIRD Designation Requirements

The AIRD designation is offered for those applicants that demonstrate a foundational knowledge regarding the resolution of troubled companies and insurer receiverships. A successful applicant for an AIRD designation must achieve a passing score on the AIRD examination. The AIRD examination questions are drawn from a bank of questions and consist of both multiple choice and true or false questions. Designation examinations are offered in conjunction with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners national meetings, and at other IAIR events.

(1) Education / Experience Standards

An applicant must have one of the following:

A bachelor's degree in business management, business administration, business law, accounting, finance, risk management and insurance, actuarial sciences, or related fields A master's degree in one of the fields listed above

An advanced or doctoral degree (e.g., in law, accounting, finance, risk management, actuarial sciences, business management, business administration, or a related field) Acceptable insurance experience of at least five (5) years

Acceptable business experience of at least ten (10) years

(2) Ethical Standards

- An applicant must submit a Background Certification, including a certification that they have not been convicted of a felony. The information contained in the Certification will be used by IAIR to validate the applicant's employment history, education, personal information and character.
- (3) Applicants are not required to have earned Continuing Education hours before applying for the AIRD Designation.
