

## CIRD Designation Requirements

The CIRD designation is offered in specific specialty areas of insurance resolutions including: accounting and financial reporting, actuarial, claims and guaranty associations, information technology, legal, reinsurance, and resolution management. A successful applicant for a CIRD designation must have experience in the specialty or specialties, achieve a passing score on the selected CIRD examination(s) and demonstrate working knowledge of those areas in an interview. The AIRD examination and CIRD examinations are drawn from a bank of questions and consist of both multiple choice and true or false questions. Designation examinations are offered in conjunction with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners national meetings, and at other IAIR events.

An applicant for a CIRD designation must demonstrate the following:

An applicant for a CIRD designation for specific specialties that are typically performed during an insurance resolution must demonstrate three (3) years of experience in one or more of the specialty areas of: accounting and financial reporting, actuarial, claims and guaranty associations, information technology, legal, reinsurance. An applicant for a CIRD designation in resolution management must demonstrate:

- (1) An applicant for a CIRD designation must have held an AIRD designation for 1 year.
- (2) Experience with the overall control and management responsibility for all aspects of one or more insurance receiverships, or participation as a member of the management team that worked directly with the receivership, for a cumulative minimum of three (3) years, and
- (3) Experience in each of the following practice areas: accounting and financial reporting, actuarial, claims and guaranty associations, information technology, legal, reinsurance.
- (4) An applicant for the CIRD designation must provide confirmation of completion of the minimum number of Continuing Education hours of CE approved by the IAIR Ethics Committee at the time an application is submitted.
